


What you can do at home

Ask questions about their experiences in school, at home and of the world around them




Reflect on learning experiences and try ways to do something better


Building Strong Foundations: How is it achieved?

Play is an essential feature that taps students' inquisitiveness and ignites a self-sustaining passion for learning.

Differentiated support



How and when will P1 students use SLS?


Students will learn with technology progressively, with light use at P1 [after Term 1] in an age-appropriate manner.






Transit Programme

- TRANsition Support for InTegration
- helps Primary 1 pupils with behavioural or social difficulties transition to the school environment
- provides early intervention by teaching selfmanagement skills through small-group and classroom support from teachers and allied educators.
- Need to <u>change the student's class</u> to be effectively supported by the Allied educator and Teachers.


WHAT DO WE DO?

- Enhance connections and promote bonding between parents, school and children.




