5. Attendance and Punctuality

Regular attendance has a significant impact on a child's learning and holistic development.

A child who is frequently absent will miss out on the learning experiences in school. It will also affect the bonds he/she forms with his/her classmates. Students should be in school during term time unless taken ill or excused from school for important private reasons. Please submit the medical certificate or valid documentation to the form teacher upon your child/ward's return to school after an absence. Please refer to our Student Handbook (page 8) for more details.

We strive to instil the value of punctuality in our students. **All students are expected to be in school by 7.30 a.m. Late arrivals (after 7.30 a.m.) will be recorded**, and a notification letter will be issued to parents for students who are late five times within five weeks. **We seek your help in ensuring that your child/ward comes to school punctually. Please note that persistent late-coming will affect your child/ward's overall conduct grade.** We also encouraged all students to report to school with a storybook and to start their day by inculcating the positive habit of reading before flag raising.

6. Semesterly Temperature-taking Exercise on 9 July 2025

To maintain schools' preparedness to re-activate the temperature-taking regime should there be a need to do so, a temperature-taking exercise will be conducted for all staff and students in Term 3 Week 2 on **Wednesday, 9 July 2025**. All students will be screened at the gates when they arrive in school. Students who are unwell will be required to seek medical attention and they can only return to school when they recover fully.

7. Cultural Exchange Programme with Warraphat School

20 of our Primary 5 students visited Warraphat School in Hat Yai, Thailand, as part of the school's cultural exchange programme in the last week of Term 2. Our students had the opportunities to experience Thai culture such as learning about traditional Thai costumes, playing Thai traditional games, trying out basic Thai boxing techniques and concocting a delicious local dessert. It was an enriching learning experience for our Primary 5 students who formed new friendships with the students from Warraphat School and developed cross-cultural skills.

9. New Muslim Canteen Stall

The school has been actively sourcing for a second Muslim canteen stallholder since October 2024. We are pleased to inform you that we have managed to secure a second Muslim stallholder. The new stall will commence operations in Term 3, and will be operated by an experienced stallholder. This additional stall will provide stability and enhance our food variety, offering dishes such as Biryani, nasi lemak and chicken rice using ingredients and cooking methods approved by Health Promotion Board.

10. Enhancements to the AMKP Environment

a. Toilet Renovation

During the June school holidays, the third and final phase of our toilet renovation works, including hacking and replacement of the sewage pipes and refurbishing the toilets with new tiles, sink and toilet seats, commenced for the Primary 1 and 3 classroom block as well as for the hall and canteen areas. As the renovation works is extensive, the toilets for the Primary 1 and 3 classroom block will be completed in phases in August and September 2025. In the meantime, our Primary 1 and 3 students will be using the toilets at the adjacent block.

b. The Poised and Confident (TPC) Learning Corner

We are delighted to share news of another of our enhancement initiative, which introduces innovative and purposeful learning spaces at our Poised and Confident (TPC) learning corner, which is designed to nurture Confident Persons, Joyful Learners, and Caring Citizens.

The TPC features nine distinct mini-zones, including the dynamic **'Make & Build'** space where students can exercise their creativity through rotating designs, and the interactive **'Voices in Action'** area that empowers students to share their learning experiences. The TPC also incorporates a **Mini-Tech Corner** that will be equipped with mounted iPads for self-directed learning, a **magnetic wall** and a **peg wall display** for showcasing student works and curated books respectively, as well as comfortable **study pods** at the school's foyer for independent learning and small group collaborative discussions.

This versatile space also includes a **stage area** for student performances, a cozy **Reading Nook**, and an engaging **Call-to-Action Wall** where students can share their reflections. These thoughtfully designed spaces will enhance our existing programmes, support school events such as performances and exhibitions, and inspire student-led initiatives. By extending learning beyond traditional classroom boundaries, these spaces will provide our students with authentic opportunities to learn, create, collaborate, and grow in an environment that promotes independent thinking and collaborative engagement.

c. Hydroponic System

As part of our commitment to making learning more hands-on and relevant for our students, our school has installed three hydroponic systems, with compliments from Teck Ghee Constituency. This will allow our young learners to experience the wonders of innovative farming techniques. Our students will take on roles as young scientists and “farmers”, learning to check the water quality, observing plant growth, understanding how plants obtain their food and witnessing the life cycle from seeding to harvest. This real-world application of science concepts will help our students to better understand topics from the Science curriculum and thus making learning joyful.


